FY 2024-25 LEGISLATIVE APPROPRIATIONS REQUEST Office of the State Prosecuting Attorney

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The OSPA is on the cusp of celebrating 100 years of service. Consistent with its history, it's important to note that nearly all of the OSPA's budget is dedicated to salaries. Salaries are particularly significant to the Office's prominence and continuity because they are the product of its three attorneys' intangible intellectual capital and loyalty to prosecution.

STATEMENT OF GRATITUDE

The Office of State Prosecuting Attorney (OSPA) is grateful for the Legislature's support and funding to continue successfully serving the citizens of Texas, prosecutors, and law enforcement.

STATUTORY AUTHORITY AND ORGANIZATION

The State Prosecuting Attorney (SPA) is appointed by the Court of Criminal Appeals (CCA) and is statutorily directed to represent the State in criminal cases in both the courts of appeals and the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals—the State's highest criminal court. See TEX. GOV'T CODE §§ 42.001, 42.005. The SPA has only two assistant prosecuting attorneys, see id., and one administrative assistant.

COVID-19 IMPACT

The OSPA's services have not been interrupted throughout the entirety of the COVID-19 pandemic. Nor has the OSPA required additional funding because of the pandemic.

DELIVERY OF EXCEPTIONAL REPRESENTATION: THE OSPA'S CRUCIAL ROLE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF CRIMINAL JURISPRUDENCE

The OSPA focuses on arguing for the strict adherence to Texas's criminal statutes and the proper application of constitutional law in a manner favorable to prosecutors and law enforcement statewide. Resulting equities and the impact on society and the law generally are also primary considerations. This is achieved by filing petitions for discretionary review (PDRs) in the CCA that are precisely engineered to persuade the Court to resolve an important legal issue and ultimately rule in the State's favor. In rare cases in which the merits of an issue and policy matters are in equipoise, we will brief both sides and stress the importance of having a clear rule for the bench and bar. The OSPA, with its extensive knowledge of CCA precedent, institutional workings, and history, carefully selects cases to present after an intermediate court of appeals has rendered a decision adverse to the State.

Because the OSPA has statewide jurisdiction, our caseload comes from both large and small counties. Smaller jurisdictions may not have the expertise or manpower to handle complex appellate issues in the CCA. And, though large jurisdictions do not have the same limitations, the OSPA collaborates with those counties to implement the best litigation strategy and develop a consistent position on far-reaching procedural and substantive issues. The OSPA also regularly helps local prosecutors by giving legal advice and reviewing and editing PDRs and briefs.

During the 2021 and 2022 fiscal years, the OSPA filed 14 briefs and 44 briefs and has reviewed 634 appellate court opinions from the intermediate courts and the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals.

Some recent litigation highlights for the OSPA include:

- Is TEX. PENAL CODE § 42.07(a)(7), which prohibits harassing electronic communications, facially unconstitutional? No. Ex parte Barton, __S.W.3d__, No. PD-1123-19, 2022 WL 1021061 (Tex. Crim. App. Apr. 6, 2022), reh'g denied (June 8, 2022).
- Did the Legislature intend punishments for both continuous sexual abuse, TEX. PENAL CODE § 21.02, and prohibited sexual conduct, TEX. PENAL CODE § 25.02, against the same child? Yes. Ramos v. State, 636 S.W.3d 646 (Tex. Crim. App. 2021), reh'g denied (Jan. 26, 2022).
- Does TEX. CODE CRIM. PROC. art. 4.07's grant of "original jurisdiction of all misdemeanors" give county courts

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jurisdiction—concurrent with district courts—over official misconduct cases? Yes. Roland v. State, 631 S.W.3d 125 (Tex. Crim. App. 2021).

- If the error at trial was in admitting evidence under a non-constitutional rule—TEX. CODE CRIM. PROC. art. 38.23—shouldn't harm be assessed under the non-constitutional harm standard in TEX. R. APP. P. 44.2(b)? Yes. Holder v. State, 639 S.W.3d 704 (Tex. Crim. App. 2022), reh'g denied (Mar. 9, 2022).
- Is a trial court presiding over a retrospective competency hearing required to force counsel on an unwilling defendant who is presumed to be competent? No. Osorio-Lopez v. State, __S.W.3d__, No. PD-0354-21, 2022 WL 2335394 (Tex. Crim. App. June 29, 2022).
- Can a Travis County district court exercise habeas jurisdiction over the Kinney County Constitutional Court cases? Pending CCA decision. In re State of Texas ex rel. Brent Smith, No. WR-93,354-02.

THE OSPA'S CURRENT BUDGET-SAVING EFFORTS

The SPA continues to reduce expenditures by attending only complimentary continuing legal education conferences and by seeking scholarships from the State Bar.

THE OSPA'S EXCEPTIONAL ITEMS

1. 10% Judicial Wide Increase

The staff positions within the Article IV Courts and Agencies require a unique level of skill. From attorneys, to clerks and interpreters, to researchers and IT professionals, the expertise needed to keep the third branch of government running is vast. Recruiting and retaining qualified staff is challenging, even more so with inflation at 8.6 percent and rising. In FY 2021, the Judiciary had the third highest turnover rate in the state by General Appropriations Act Article at 14.5 percent. Salaries within the judiciary are not keeping up with inflation and are not competitive with other agencies or the private sector. Over the past year, Article IV Courts and Agencies have noticed a concerning trend of positions remaining open for lengthy periods of time and a steep decline in qualified applicants. Some entities have resorted to paying for recruiting tools to get a small pool of qualified candidates. Salary compression is also a major issue, where out of necessity, positions are posted at higher salaries than what current employees are making. The Article IV Courts and Agencies request a 10 percent salary increase for staff to maintain and recruit a strong and experienced judicial workforce.

Two Assistant Prosecutors' Justification:

- General Counsel IV salary is lower than several comparable judicial agencies:
- Texas Supreme Court General Counsel IV: \$137,025;
- Court of Criminal Appeals General Counsel III: \$129,024; Office of Court Administration General Counsel V: \$164,000;
- Fifth Court of Appeals General Counsel III: \$120,614.
- The prior increase was granted by the 86th Legislature.

Single Administrative Assistant Justification:

- Support coincides with the SPA's broad range of duties and responsibilities as the Executive Director, CFO, CEO, COO, Human Resources Manager, Communications Manager, Open Records Coordinator, Media & Outreach Director, Legislative Affairs Chief, etc;
- Assisting 3 attorneys requires working knowledge of the criminal justice system, case dispositions, some criminal appellate procedures, & the types of documents filed.

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• The last increase of \$3,000 was granted by the 86th Legislature.

NOTE: if the administrative assistant position receives an increase above \$34,859, the maximum pay authorized for an Admin I, she will need to be reclassified as an Admin II (range: \$26,332-41,355).

- 2. Equity Adjustment for Single Administrative Assistant
- The current \$33,000 salary is low in comparison to Living Wage and Austin Average: \$33,000 is only \$2.24 over MIT's hourly Living Wage Calculation (\$13.63) for Austin for a single adult; \$2.16 under Indeed's average wage in Austin (\$18.05).

This position has been proven to be under-classified for the duties and responsibilities performed:

- Support coincides with the SPA's broad range of duties and responsibilities as the Executive Director, CFO, CEO, COO, Human Resources Manager, Communications Manager, Open Records Coordinator, Media & Outreach Director, Legislative Affairs Chief, etc.; and
- Assisting 3 attorneys requires working knowledge of the criminal justice system, case dispositions, some criminal appellate procedures, & the types of documents filed.

NOTE: if the administrative assistant position receives an increase above \$34,859, the maximum pay authorized for an Admin I, she will need to be reclassified as an Admin II (range: \$26,332-41,355).

CARRY-OVER AUTHORITY IS RESPECTFULLY REQUESTED

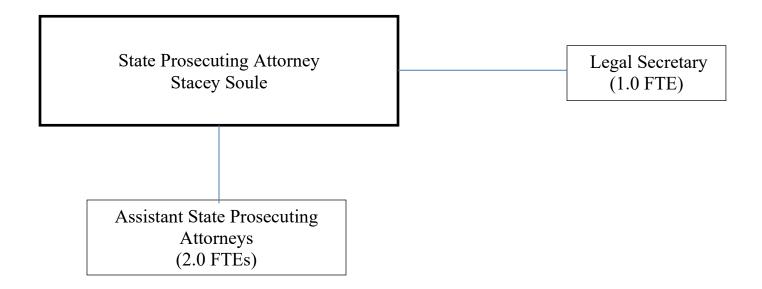
Finally, the SPA asks to retain the authority to carry over unexpended balances within the biennium to ensure flexibility within its already tight budget.

DESCRIPTION / JUSTIFICATION:

The staff positions within the Article IV require a unique level of skill. From attorneys, to clerks, and interpreters, to researchers and IT professionals, the expertise needed to keep the Judicial Branch running is vast. Recruiting and retaining qualified staff is challenging, especially with inflation at 8.6% and rising. In FY 2021, the Judiciary had the third highest turnover rate in the state by GAA (14.5 %). Judicial salaries are outpaced by inflation and are not competitive with other agencies or the private sector. Recently, Article IV Courts and Agencies noticed a concerning trend of positions remaining open for lengthy periods of time and a steep decline in qualified applicants. Salary compression is also a major issue, where out of necessity, positions are posted at higher salaries than what current employees are making. The Article IV Courts and Agencies request a 10 percent salary increase for staff to maintain and recruit a strong and experienced judicial workforce. Two Assistant Prosecutor's Justification: (1) salaries are particularly significant to the Office's prominence and continuity because they are the product of its three attorneys' intangible intellectual capital and loyalty to prosecution; (2) general Counsel IV salary is lower than several comparable judicial agencies: Texas Supreme Court General Counsel IV: \$137,025, Office of Court Administration General Counsel V: \$164,000, Fifth Court of Appeals General Counsel III: \$120,614; (3) the prior increase was granted by the 86th Legislature. Single Administrative Assistant Justification: (1) support coincides with the SPA's broad range of duties and responsibilities as the Executive Director, CFO, CEO, COO, Human Resources Manager, etc; (2) assisting 3 attorneys requires working knowledge of the criminal justice system, case dispositions, some criminal appellate procedures, & the types of documents filed; (3) the last increase of \$3,000 was granted by the 86th Legislature.

EXTERNAL/INTERNAL FACTORS:

The OSPA risks losing valuable state employees to larger state agencies that can afford higher salaries or the private sector. Two Assistant Prosecutors: The agency's great responsibility to represent the State before the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals means that there are very few attorneys who would be qualified to perform the essential and non-essential job functions of the General Counsel IV position. Thus, the 2 OSPA Assistant Prosecutors, with approximately 30 years of specialized practice combined, are

The Office of Court Administration (OCA) currently handles the procurements for this agency. SPA currently has no full or part time Procurement or HUB Coordinator.
